

Donating to the Public Mothers' Milk Bank

What does it entail?

The process involves preserving your surplus breast milk. Your donations of milk make it possible for Héma-Québec to provide pasteurized human milk to infants born extremely preterm who require medical care in a hospital setting.

What are the benefits?

You and your child will not receive any benefit from your donation. However, there may be a health benefit for the preterm infant receiving the milk.

Criteria to register

- Breastfeeding your baby and able to produce surplus milk;
- Be in good health;
- Be 18 years of age or older;
- Be a non-smoker and not be using tobacco or nicotine-based products (e.g., gum, patches or electronic cigarettes).

How to register?

Online

- Fill and sign the registration form:

- Sign this consent form;
- Return the documents to the Héma-Québec representative at your first meeting.

By mail or email

- Complete and sign the registration form;
- Fill out and have a health professional sign the "Professional's consent" form;
- Sign this consent form;
- Return the documents to Héma-Québec.

Your qualification

Héma-Québec will provide you with an information guide on human milk donation and you will be contacted by a Héma-Québec representative to fill out a qualification questionnaire about your medical history and risk behaviours to protect the health of the recipient.

- In the event that you do not qualify, the representative will explain to you the reasons for your exclusion.
- If you qualify, you will be asked to provide blood samples for serological testing.

Donation process

Following your qualification, you will be responsible for:

- Expressing your milk following the hygiene measures recommended by Héma-Québec;
- Freezing the milk;
- Contacting Héma-Québec at regular intervals to pick up your bottles.

You will be contacted by a Héma-Québec representative who will follow up with you every two months.

Qualification of your milk

Your milk will be sent to Héma-Québec's Public Mothers' Milk Bank to be qualified. It will be subjected to:

- Microbiological analyzes;
- Pasteurization process.

Other uses of your donation

- Your milk donation may be used for training, optimization or quality control of the product.
- If your donation (or part of it) cannot be used for the Public Mothers' Milk Bank, it may be used for research purposes if you consent to this. The section "Donating Human Milk for Research" below explains what it entails.
 - Otherwise, your donation will be destroyed.

Blood tests

Your blood sample will be tested to screen for the following blood-borne infectious diseases:

- Hepatitis B and C;
- Syphilis;
- Human immunodeficiency virus (HIV);
- Cytomegalovirus (CMV);
- Human T-lymphotropic virus (HTLV I/II).

You will be notified of any positive or indeterminate result on any of these tests while ensuring confidentiality. You will be invited to provide Héma-Québec with your physician's contact information so that he or she can, if necessary, perform proper medical follow-up.

- The banking process will be stopped.
- In the case of a disease that must be reported, the results will be sent to the Québec Public Health Authorities.

Risks

The volume of blood that you must provide is little (approximately 2 tbsp.); this is not harmful to your health. You may feel some discomfort associated with the collection of blood samples, such as bruising, pain or redness at the puncture site.

Consent

Your participation in the Public Mothers' Milk Bank and donation of human milk are entirely voluntary. You can withdraw your consent and terminate your participation at any time without consequences.

You will not receive any compensation for your participation.

Donating Human Milk for Research

What does it entail?

If your milk donation does not qualify for the Public Bank, it is still valuable for research purposes on human milk. Only the portion of your milk that cannot be used for the Public Mothers' Milk Bank will go to research.

Ethical approval of projects

For a research project to benefit from human milk unqualified for banking, it must have been approved by the Héma-Québec Research Ethics Board.

Héma-Québec distributes human milk for research projects that are duly approved ethically and scientifically.

The milk used for research will be destroyed once the research has been completed.

Confidentiality of your information

Héma-Québec protects your personal information. It will not be disclosed to the research teams. Milk will be identified with a unique identifier that will be kept confidential at Héma-Québec.

Héma-Québec may provide researchers with anonymous data on your health status for the purposes of qualifying the sample for their research project. However, it will be impossible for the researcher to identify you.

The results of the research may be the subject of a publication or a communication by the researcher. At no time will it be possible to identify you.

In order to verify the proper conduct of the research and ensure your protection, your research file could be reviewed by the Héma-Québec Research Ethics Board.

Risks and benefits

Donating for research does not pose any additional risk to your health or that of your child.

There is no benefit to you or your child and you will not be compensated for your participation.

However, by consenting for research, you will help researchers better understand human milk's unique properties and improve existing treatments. These scientific advances will benefit the population as a whole.

Consent

You are free to support human milk research and you can withdraw your consent at any time without prejudice.

The research results could contribute to the creation of commercial products from which you will not receive any financial benefit.

Personal information collected by Héma-Québec

Your consent to participate in the Public Mothers' Milk Bank allows Héma-Québec to collect only the information about you that is necessary.

All information collected by Héma-Québec about you is treated confidentially and securely and is retained as long as necessary.

You have the right to consult your medical record to verify the information collected and have it rectified if necessary.

I have read this form and understand its contents. I have had the opportunity to ask a Héma-Québec representative all my questions and have received satisfactory answers.

I understand that it is important that I inform Héma-Québec of any change in my health status.

I understand that Héma-Québec reserves the right to contact me, if necessary, for any medical reason related to my health, that of my child or that of the recipient.
